

# DR. REX AND LILLIAN DIVELEY PEDIATRIC ORTHOPAEDIC LECTURESHIP



Rex Diveley was born in Bazine, Kansas in 1893. The son of a variety store owner, they moved into the Oklahoma territory when he was young.

He attended medical school at the University of Kansas and served in France in 1917 during World War I as head of a radiology unit.

Dr. Diveley partnered with orthopedist Dr. Frank Dickson to establish the Dickson-Diveley clinic in 1927. The next year, the clinic found a home at St. Luke's Hospital.

Dr. Diveley posted overseas during World War II as a senior consultant in orthopedic surgery.

During his career, he also served in many leadership roles, including as President of the Mid-Central States Orthopedic Society, Treasurer of the American Orthopedic Association, and a member of the Board of Governors of the American College of Surgeons.

Dr. Diveley and his wife, Lillian Diveley established an endowed fund for this lectureship in 1986, in the spirit of resident education, about which the Diveleys felt passionately.
