REGISTRATION FEE

For 2022, CAPS registration will be in two phases, outlined below:

Live-Streaming and On-Demand Participation (Phase 1) - \$200

- Access to on-demand, recorded sessions 1-2 weeks following the conclusion of the live event.
 On-demand recordings will be available for registrants to view at their leisure though Dec. 4, 2022.
